Sign Up for Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) MyAccount

The CRA's <u>MyAccount</u> for individuals is a secure portal that lets you view your personal income tax and benefits and manage your taxes online.

Expired Status Cards

Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) says expired status cards remain valid during the pandemic, stating service providers should accept status cards or Temporary Confirmation of Registration Documents, with a secondary piece of ID, until ISC offices reopen to the public.
