



Council of the Haida Nation Research Permit Application – October 2020

All researchers conducting work on Haida Gwaii must have an approved application before starting work in a community or conducting interviews. Information cannot be collected before receiving a file number.

A non-refundable application fee of \$150 is required for your request to be processed. The processing of your application shall not be considered an endorsement or approval of the project. Additional location, filming, access to information, or other fees will apply and may require additional applications.

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the information provided is complete and accurate. If your research changes, such as an unexpected delay, site visit or the addition of interview question(s), you must submit a project update to the Council of the Haida Nation Communications Program.

Applications are reviewed once per month and can take 4-6 weeks to process. It is recommended that you submit your application with ample time for review and questions. Submissions are due on or before the LAST FRIDAY of each month. If submitted afterwards, they will be reviewed in the next intake.

Upon completion, part of your responsibility to the Haida Nation is to provide a hard copy and digital copy of your project to our library and archives and provide a short overview of your experience while conducting your research.

NOTE: 'Haida Nation,' 'Council of the Haida Nation,' or any reference to the Haida Nation may not be used without permission.

Approval to proceed is not an endorsement of the project, and does not imply any type of partnership between the Council of the Haida Nation and applicant. It also does not grant access to any CHN records, archives, or data -- this requires additional approval.
